

Sheriff Checklist

Thank you for expressing your interest in becoming a Common Law Sheriff under authority of a Common Law Assembly

Becoming a sheriff is a commitment that will not be for everyone. Usually an assembly would only have one or two, or maybe three sheriffs. We are in different time right now, with a rogue corporation posing as a government, completely disregarding their own legislation and imposing unlawful and illegal restrictions, fines and penalties on the people of Australia.

Legislation, rules of the corporations, are written to manage the people as the debtor, not the creditor, as we are.

We are managed and governed as chattel. A system over 720 years old.

The work of a sheriff is varied, and sheriffs and their peacekeepers are our keepers of the peace. You will attend events with other sheriffs and peacekeepers and raise awareness of the common law movement. You may make presentations to community groups to help raise awareness, serve documents to offending bodies and participate in common law court procedures as we move forward.

Below are some questions to answer to help you decide if this is a role you wish to take on.

1. Do you have a criminal conviction? If yes unfortunately you are disqualified from becoming a sheriff. You are still welcome at the assembly. Please email us if you are in doubt or have questions about this.

- 2. Are you willing to attend the regular assembly meetings, your local sheriff meetings and fortnightly National Sheriffs meetings, via zoom?
- 3. Are you willing to attend occasional training?
- 4. Are you prepared to commit to learning about common law and Lawful Due Process?
- 5. Are you passionate about transitioning from corporate control to a kinder and fairer system for everyone?

You will need two others if you proceed through an induction as there is a standard Operating Procedure in place requiring sheriffs to work in a minimum group of three.
